

Red Brangus — How They Were Developed

t took considerable insight back in the early 1940s to foresee that crossbreeding with a little ear was going to be the wave of the future and Malcolm Levi of Spicewood, Texas, was a man who had it. He'd been born, married and had started raising a family in Pennsylvania when he decided to leave the East and head west to Texas to get into the cattle business. In 1936 he bought the Paleface Ranch, named after the Hereford cattle that had traditionally been run on it. A group of sorry looking Brahman cross cows were included in the purchase and Malcolm bought a small registered Hereford herd as well. His first calf crop taught him a few things. The Hereford cows which had gotten all the attention and the best pastures produced calves that weighed 400 lb. and brought five cents/lb. But the Brahman cross cows that had been put out in a back pasture with an old cross bull and had received no attention produced calves that weighed 500 lb. and still brought five cents. He hadn't been in the business

long enough to be prejudiced and so then and there he decided to go with the Brahman crosses. He experimented with Angus, Shorthorn and Hereford crosses and decided the Angus cross was best.

By the early 1940s Malcolm was producing both black and Red Brangus cattle, the "reds" being offspring of black Angus cows and white Brahman bulls. He pulled the reds out and created a separate herd because there were several advantages to their red color that had future promise. The most obvious one was their use in crossbreeding programs on Hereford cows. Back then the little bit of ear didn't mean much to anyone, but he'd seen for himself what it could do and he also saw that the red coloring would remove the problems of pink eye, cancer eye and still give a pretty uniform looking calf crop. He sold the last of his "blacks" in 1957 and in 1959 with his son, Mike, helped to form the American Red Brangus Association.



Online Registration



How do you register your American Red Brangus cattle ...

...with paper and pencil or keyboard and computer? We understand that many breeders still use the paper and pencil method as they have been registering their cattle that way for years.

 \mathbf{S} ome may even wonder why anyone would use the online system to register cattle, after all the old system has worked great.

But has it really worked that great? Have you ever received your registration papers back with an error on them and thought, "What the heck. Why is this wrong?" Personally, I would not want to be the one trying to decipher my chicken scratch handwriting. It's all too easy to see how a quickly written Bill Manso could be translated to Bell Mango. So there is definitely one clear advantage to registering your cattle online – less errors. You can see and check the data exactly how it will be printed on your papers. Not to mention, you save trees, ink and money for postage. So put down the pencil, turn on the computer, and give online registration a chance.

The first step in registering American Red Brangus cattle electronically is signing up to have access to the online process. This is really simple, you can find the "Online Registry Sign-up & Payment Authorization Form" on the American Red Brangus website, *www.americanredbrangus. org.* Simply go to Member Services and select the "Online Registration Link" and click it. You will see the forms you need to fill out in order to register cattle online. It may seem a bit odd that you have to fill out a piece of paper and mail it or fax it to the Association so you can get access to the electronic registration system, but we feel certain there are some legal reasons for this process. Information that you will need in order to fill out this form include things like: member/herd number, name or company name, phone/fax number, e-mail address and your credit card information.

Some of you may be saying right now, "I knew I couldn't do this. I don't have an e-mail address!" No worries! I bet you have a family member or possibly a friend that you can use their e-mail address in order to use the electronic process. Or maybe it is time to get an e-mail address. There are lots of free options where you can set up an account at no cost, such as Yahoo or Gmail. Either way, whether you use a family member's address, a friend's address or sign up for your own e-mail address, the American Red Brangus Association (ARBA) will use the e-mail address you submit to send you the user name and password for your new ARBA internet account.

Once you receive an e-mail from the Association with your account information and instructions, you are ready to start using the online process. The online registry allows you to do lots of different tasks, for example: you can update your calving-aged cow herd inventory, update your bull herd inventory, record calves, record weaning weights, etc. For now though, we are just interested in registering a calf, so let's get started!

From the ARBA website click on Member Services, select Enhanced Member Log In and you will arrive at a log in page. (Under Member Services, there is an Online Registry Help Page that you can print out.) Put in your user name and your password and click "Sign On."

On the next screen, click on "Create a New Batch." Now you may say, "Batch? What do you mean batch?" Yet when you look up the definition of batch when discussing computers it is simply a group of jobs, data or programs treated as a unit for computer processing. Personally, I prefer to think of the phrase batch in terms of cooking. You bake a batch of cookies, so you may have two dozen cookies that you bake one afternoon. Although there are 24 individual cookies it is still considered all one batch. Let's say you have 12 calves to register. You can register all 12 in one batch. They will each receive their individual pedigrees; you just register them all at the same time, making one batch. Or you can register them individually, creating a new batch every day. It is your choice. So, a batch is simply a grouping of things that you have worked on for that day.

The next screen will let you choose what type of work you will be doing online. For this article we want to register calves, so click in the radio button by "Calf Record Form."

On the next screen you will click "Add" to add one animal to your batch and you will arrive at the electronic version of the paper registration form.

If you have filled out registration papers before you will see boxes that look similar to the paper version for your data. If you have never filled in registration papers, we recommend you call the Dripping Springs office at 512-858-7285 and Michele will walk you through it.

To fill in the blanks on the form you simply click in the first empty field and start typing. Then either click on each empty field after that or use the tab key on your keyboard after entering data in one field to proceed to the next field in the form. One thing you do NOT want to do is hit the enter/return key on your keyboard to get to the next field as this will not work. Also, down arrows indicate there is a drop down list available with more information. This makes it easy as all your choices are right there for you!


Once you think you are finished filling in the form, you can check to see if you forgot anything by highlighting "Check Data, Redisplay If Errors" and then clicking the "Go" button. The system will tell in you red bold highlights by each field if you have made a mistake and give you a chance to fix it. If you choose "Check Data and Proceed" and you have errors it will tell you "Fatal Error" on the next screen in the status column and allow you to go back and fix the error. If you get interrupted while filling out your online registration - say to take a batch of cookies out of the oven - do not be concerned, as you can come back and finish at a later date. Simply highlight "Check Data and Proceed," click "Go"

and then log out. All your data will be waiting for you when you are ready to log back in and get to work on registering your calves again.

Once you have finished with the batch, highlighted "Check Data and Proceed" and clicked "Go," you will be taken to the screen with your batches listed. Once all the data proves to be correct, the system will tell you in the Status column that the batch is validated and will allow you to click "Submit."

Once on the Submit screen, you can edit the comments section, delete the batch or submit the batch to the ARBA. Click "Submit the Batch to the ARBA" and you are done!

We hope you try this very easy system for registering your calves. It is not nearly as hard as it seems. Let us know if you try the system and what you think. Remember, we are smarter than the computers that seem to run the world, so you can do this and you can outsmart the computer. It just takes a little getting used to!

Membership fees are \$75 for **Active Members;** \$75 for **Associate Members;** \$75 for **Active Juniors;** and \$30 for **Junior Memberships.** The association earmarks \$25 of each membership (excluding regular Junior Memberships) for advertising funds. Those eligible for Active (adult) and Active Junior (ages 9-21) memberships must be reputable breeders that will register quality American Red Brangus cattle. Associate Members. Junior Members are persons interested in American Red Brangus cattle, but who are not eligible to be Active Members. Junior Members are between the ages of 9 (or 8 and has completed second grade) through their 21st birthday who are interested in and/or own American Red Brangus cattle, but will not be registering calves from them.



Junior Scholarship Recipients

Established in 2012 the American Red Brangus Foundation began collecting donations for the purpose of supporting youth of the American Red Brangus in pursuit to further education. As the years have gone by, the Foundation has been able to add opportunities for AJRBA youth to earn scholarships in addition to the traditional graduating senior awards. Just a few years ago the Foundation Board agreed to allocate money each year to be awarded to the top three winners of each showmanship division at the AJRBA National Show.

The 2016 National Junior Show was no different and the top three contestants of the three age divisions in the showmanship contest were awarded a scholarship that will accrue until their senior year. Upon their graduation the money that has been awarded during their show career will be made available to them under the standard scholarship rules and guidelines. By establishing this type of contest where juniors have the opportunity to earn scholarships throughout their young career, juniors can build a financial vault for their education and future. Utilizing the showmanship contest as a venue to award these scholarships allows every junior the opportunity to earn an award.

This contest is one that allows each exhibitor and their calf to go out and display the hard work that has taken place over the previous several months at home and at other shows. The exhibitors and their calves go out before a judge and get placed based on their showmanship skills.

This year the top three exhibitors in each division were awarded scholarships. The champion showman of each division earned a \$500.00 scholarship, the reserve showman earned \$300.00 and third place showman earned \$200.00. As stated above, these amounts are accrued throughout their show career until the exhibitors graduate their senior year in high school, at which time those scholarships will become eligible to be paid out based on the standard rules and guidelines of the scholarship program.


