American Red Brangus Association Junior Scholarship Opportunities for 2023

The American Red Brangus Association has scholarships available for graduating seniors. The scholarships are funded through contributions of Association members and fundraising efforts. These scholarships will be awarded at the awards banquet at the American Junior Red Brangus National Show on Saturday, June 17, 2023. The number of scholarships and amount will be determined after funds are raised.

Eligibility Requirements

In order to be eligible with the American Red Brangus Association Scholarship, the following requirements must be met:

- Applicant must be a member in good standing of the American Junior Red Brangus Association for two years (24 calendar months from initial application/membership date) at application deadline.
- Applicant must be a graduating High School Senior.
- Applicant must have taken either the SAT or ACT college entrance exam, with proof of score noted on an official transcript or letter from an appropriate school official verifying the student had taken either of these exams. **Results will be forwarded to the ARBA office no later than May 15, 2023.** Note: It is the Applicants responsibility to ensure the results of the exam and the High School transcript are in the office by the designated date. Applications will be considered incomplete if the above information is not in the office by May 15, 2023.
- Applicants must attend a University, Junior College, or Technical School and take a minimum of 12 hour course load, while maintaining a 2.0 GPA.

Applications will only be accepted if they are complete. Please make certain **ALL** questions are answered to the best of your ability.

All Applications must be received in the American Red Brangus office no later than May 15, 2023. If application arrives at the office after May 15, 2023 the application WILL NOT be considered.

Applicant must attend the awards banquet on Saturday, June 17, 2023 to receive the scholarship.

Applicant must make themselves available for a personal interview with the scholarship committee Thursday, June 15 during the National Junior Show in Brenham, Texas.

Instructions for Completion of Scholarship Application

Applications will only be accepted if they are thoroughly completed. Use only sheets provided; if extra space is needed you may use the back of the sheet.

Applications are to be mailed directly to the American Red Brangus Association Office, Attention Scholarship Committee. All applications will be evaluated by the scholarship committee and those students whose applications pass an initial screening process will be required to undergo a personal interview. Those students will be notified by the Scholarship Chairman for scheduling a personal interview. The successful recipient(s) will be announced at the American Red Brangus National Junior Show.

All applications must be typed or completed in black ink.

The last three pages of the application are provided for personal references and are extremely important. They are to be returned to you in a sealed envelope and forwarded with your original application. References must be submitted from the following: 1) American Red Brangus Breeder (other than a member of your immediate family), 2) County Agent FFA or 4H Club Adult Leader, and 3) School Principal, Counselor, or Teacher. These references are required and are confidential. Please forward the **SEALED** personal references with your original application packet.

All original applications will be retained by the ARBA. If information contained in application is required for future use, it must be copied before mailing. Send the original application to the American Red Brangus Association, by **May 15, 2023**.

The recipients of these awards must meet the following additional requirements:

Payment of the scholarship will be in 2 equal installments.

To retain the scholarship, the recipient must complete at least one semester at a college, university or technical school the year the scholarship is awarded.

The student must forward proof of enrollment to the ARBA office no later than October 1 of the year in which they are named the recipient or the scholarship is forfeited.

The scholarship funds will be distributed to the scholarship recipient through the appropriate school financial office, after proof of enrollment is received in the ARBA office.

The second portion of the scholarship will be dispersed, once proof of enrollment for the following semester and a copy of the previous semester's transcript are received in the ARBA office. The total scholarship must be paid out within a twelve month period from the original award date.

Recipients must maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher, while carrying a minimum of twelve credit hours or equivalent. Scholarship recipients must provide proof of enrolled hours and GPA to the ARBA.

In the event that a recipient becomes ineligible, the remaining portion of the scholarship will be forfeited.
